

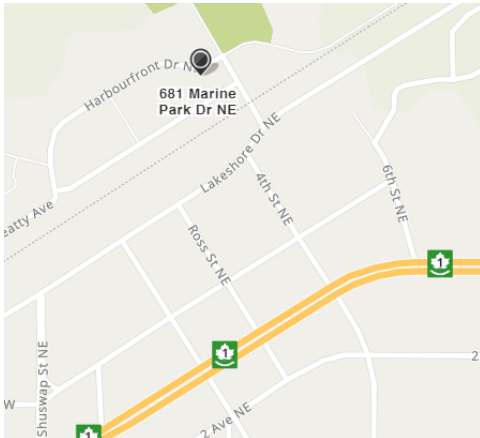

Our Fee for Service Programs

The Nest

Children who qualify

- Are under 6 years of age
- Are diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder
- Have completed an Autism Funding Agreement with Ministry of Children and Family Development (MCFD)



Service options available

- Morning or afternoon sessions
 - 2 to 3 sessions/week
 - 2 hrs/session
- After school sessions (for Kindie students)
 - 2 to 4 sessions/week
 - 1.5 hours per session

Services are

- Individualized to your child
- 1 on 1 with a Behaviour Interventionist
- Optional to include an Occupational Therapist, a Physiotherapist or parent coaching or consultation with a Behaviour Consultant
- Paid through Autism Funding or families can use private funds

Positive Behaviour Support

Children who qualify

- Birth to 18 years of age
- Autism Spectrum Disorder diagnosis is not required

Service options available

- Functional Behaviour Assessments
- Positive Behaviour Support Plans
- Parent coaching
- Advocate at school IEP meetings for services and support
- Collaborate with your child's other service providers

Services are

- Provided by a Board Certified Behaviour Analyst
- Paid through Autism Funding or families can use private funds



Project Affinity

Children who qualify

- 8 to 18 years of age
- Are diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder or have other disabilities
- Able to participate independently without 1-1 support



Service options available

- Small after-school peer groups
 - 8 to 12 week session blocks
 - 1.5 hours per week
- Out of school specialized day camps
 - Spring Break and Summer
 - 5 hours per day

Sessions will be led in small groups

- Encourage positive peer learning and exploration of social skills
- Be centred around youth with similar interests and ages

Services are

- Provided by trained staff
- Paid through Autism Funding or families can use private funds
